SHORT BIOGRAPHY

Brenda Spotton Visano is a distinguished University Professor of economics and public policy at York University. Brenda has over 2 decades of experience with community-engaged research advancing access to financial services and policy-based research analyzing funding frameworks. Community capacity building efforts include advising First Nations on options for funding social and education programs, development and assessment of financial literacy education programs for networks of community agencies, and analyses of policy issues associated with alternative high-cost lending options (e.g., payday loans). In addition to publishing numerous scholarly books and articles in academic journals, she has contributed to several reports for various Canadian government agencies, First Nations organizations, UNESCO, and NGOs. She has been a member of the national Financial Literacy Research Committee of the Financial Consumer Agency of Canada and President of the Canadian Women Economists Network. Her research, teaching, and university community service have been honoured with national, provincial and university level awards recognizing her contributions.

Her widely published interdisciplinary scholarship advances a heterodox perspective on macroeconomics and microfinance. Her passion for promoting access and diversity in theories, practices and the professions of economics and finance lies at the core of all her scholarly and professional engagements. Taking a "critical" or "progressive" approach to economic inquiry, her scholarship most broadly encompasses the interaction between economics, the economy, and institutions. She uses interdisciplinary materials from economics, sociology, business and political science to examine comparatively the history and evolution of instability in and access to financial institutions and markets. Access to higher education complements her economic research. Among her many publications is her co-authored book on Financial Vulnerability (with Jerry Buckland, Palgrave Macmillan, 2022), a co-edited book, Payday Lending in Canada in a Global Context (with Jerry Buckland and Chris Robinson), her 2006 sole-authored book Financial Crises: Socio-economic Causes and Institutional Context examining the susceptibility of financial systems to periodic collapse, and her co-edited book Room to Grow: Celebrating Atkinson's Living Legacy (with Kristin Taylor), a collection of reflections on the contributions of Atkinson College to advancing higher education for non-traditional students. In addition to publishing numerous scholarly articles in academic journals and books, she is the author of several reports for various government ministries and agencies in Canada, UNESCO, NGOs and indigenous organizations.

Dr. Spotton Visano has been an adviser to agencies of the Canadian Federal Government, the not-for-profit sector, labour organizations, First Nations organizations and other universities. She is a member of the national Consumer Protection Advisory Committee of the Financial Consumer Agency of Canada, the Progressive Economics Forum Steering Committee, and the community-based Black Creek Financial Action Network. She has served as President of the Canadian Women's Association Network; a member of the provincial committee to develop a multi-employer Jointly Sponsored Pension Plan (JSPP) for the Ontario university sector; as Director of the ACCESS Community Capital Fund. University service contributions include Chair of the University Senate and inaugural Director of the Transition Year Program at York University. She was chair and chief spokesperson for a 7-union coalition of more than 4000 active members of the University Pension Plan and has been the union's chief negotiator for 4 Collective Agreements between the York University, Faculty and Unit-level policy, planning, search, and adjudication committees.

CANADIAN CONSUMER FINANCIAL VULNERABILITY & RESILIENCE

Financial Inclusion. The overarching question driving this research is how to best ensure full financial inclusion with the availability of safe, sound, and affordable basic payments and non-mortgage credit services for Canadian consumers in an evolving financial landscape? Alternative short-term consumer credit includes instalment loans, title loans (loans secured by a lien on a car, e.g.), rent-to-own contracts (primarily for furniture), and pawnbroking, as well as payments services such as remittances and cheque-cashing. The imminent disruption from financial technological (fintech) innovations affecting consumer credit and payments practices promises further complication. Financial innovation creates new ways to unbundle traditional banking services, increasing the threat of further financial exclusion.

This project examines how these alternative products and services (in-store and on-line) compare to each other, to payday loans, and to mainstream banking options, thus extending our recent examination of the Canadian payday loan industry. This research is grounded in an institutional framework for understanding the organization and structure of financial intermediation. Theories of financial regulation highlight consumer financial protection as one of the primary goals of regulation. Legislation designed to meet this goal influences transactions costs, information costs, and participation costs. Legislation critically impacts consumer risk exposure and along with technological innovation shapes the resulting financial landscape defining the supply of Canadian consumer financial options. <u>Actual and Anticipated Outputs</u>: Books, Scholarly Journal Articles, Public Communications
